Looking and learning

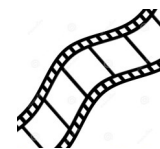
During the six weeks the topics covered include:

- Brain and Emotional Development

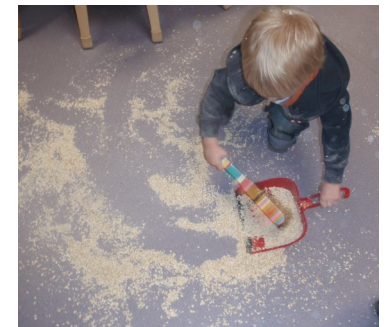


- Understanding your child's behaviour
